### Senate Committee on Student Discipline and Subcommittee Trainings

- 1. SCSD/SUSC/SGSC Training:** OSCR staff members conducted training sessions for all members of the subcommittees and the SCSD. New and returning SCSD members participated in basic training at the first scheduled business meeting. New SUSC and SGSC members attended a four-hour training program on due process, questioning, sensitivity to social justice issues, sanctioning guidance, and deliberations. New and returning SUSC, SGSC, and SCSD members attended a four-hour mock hearing for a physical violence case in order to practice and develop their questioning and deliberation skills as well as to discuss the unique challenges and issues related to campus violence.

2. ***Subcommittee on Sexual Misconduct Training:*** Over three 8-hour sessions in late August and early September of 2017, OSCR trained the new members of the Subcommittee on Sexual Misconduct along with new members of the Senate Committee on Student Discipline who would be responsible for hearing appeals in sexual misconduct cases (Returning members of both groups joined the new members during the second session to complete their annual training requirements). This training, though designed by OSCR staff, was a strong collaborative effort, as we invited student affairs colleagues, academic colleagues, and professionals within the local community to address the trainees.

### **Senate Committee on Student Discipline Actions**

1. ***Changes to Sanctioning Guidance:*** The SCSD added a comment to the sanctioning guidance for noncompliance with no contact directives and created new guidance for submitting false criminal/disciplinary history disclosures during the admission process.
2. ***Student Disciplinary Procedures Minor Revisions:*** The SCSD considered several minor changes to the Student Disciplinary Procedures, including Appendix D, proposed by the Executive Director. These included the addition of policy statements required by state or federal law, minor revisions to the list of formal sanctions, and new language recognizing the disciplinary process of the Carle Illinois College of Medicine. All of these changes/additions were approved.
3. ***Conduct Probation Transcript Notations:*** In accordance with professional best practices and at the request of OSCR staff, the Senate Committee on Student Discipline voted, at their November 27 business meeting, to end the practice of noting active Conduct Probation sanctions on student transcripts.
4. ***No Contact Directive Procedures:*** OSCR staff developed a set of formal procedures for issuing No Contact Directives. These procedures were approved by the Senate Committee on Student Discipline at their April 9 business meeting and have been incorporated into the Student Disciplinary Procedures.
5. ***Subcommittee Member Selection:*** OSCR led a successful recruitment and selection process for student, faculty, and staff members of the subcommittees on student conduct. The Senate Committee on Student Discipline approved 21 new undergraduate student members, 3 new graduate student members, 6 new faculty members, and 2 new staff members. This is the largest number of faculty additions in at least six selection cycles.
